Recognizing that good design is an investment in the future, ATA Architecture was successful in creating harmony between the buildings and their surrounding texture. The architectural forms and expressions utilized throughout the complex are in tune with surrounding landforms and natural terrain, thus reducing the impact of the buildings from the city below. This was achieved through the use of a consistent building language, durable materials, and special attention to human scale. Block patterns replicate the stratus of nearby Sheep Mountain Range, with colors blending into the desert while maintaining a visual unity. Buildings have wide wrap around armadas, constructed with steel posts and weathered corrugated metal overhangs whose patina and textures are reminiscent of old ranch style houses.

## Clark County Shooting Complex:

ATA Architecture is the Architect Of Record for the Clark County Shooting Complex - Phase I. This modern-themed shooting park, gained momentum and support in 2000. It became fully operational in 2010, realizing over 10 years of citizen efforts with state, local, and national government entities. Nested along a terraced roadway that winds up a slight incline of the mountainside from the park entry; the facilities are accessed via switchback trails and roundabouts that follow natural topography. Taking advantage of the land forms created by the trail, site lines of buildings and parking lots from below are minimized, which make the buildings almost invisible from the city of Las Vegas. Approached from the south, the 2,900 acre shooting park is located at the northerly edge of Las Vegas. Current facilities reside on approximately 178 acres with future build-out planned for 900 acres. Park facilities include: Hunter Education; Rifle/Pistol Center; Shotgun Center; and Park Office; storage and maintenance areas. The facility serves specific activities related to shooting; providing a variety of range choices to the end users. The park encourages public use and is geared to serve multiple diverse user groups, providing classroom/training facilities, restrooms, convenience stores, meeting rooms and multi-purpose room. Each of the centers provides covered walkways and protective areas for public to enjoy the breathtaking view of the city, while gathering to talk and interact with other users.
